

- 1. Call to Order-Chairman Bennett called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:03 PM.
- 2. Invocation Leader-Pastor Nathaniel Anderson with Evergreen Church
- 3. Pledge of Allegiance Leader-Retired 27 1/2-year Airforce Security Police, Victor Balaguer Gonzalez.
- 4. Any addition or deletion to June 4, 2024, Agenda-There were no additions or deletions.
- 5. Approval of June 4, 2024, Agenda-<u>Commissioner David Lowman made the motion to approve.</u> Commissioner Randy Dixon seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- 6. Approval of Minutes from May 7, 2024, Regular Meeting. -Commissioner Graham Raley made a motion to approve. Commissioner Randy Dixon seconded. The motion carried.

9. County Employee of the Month-Commissioner Randy Dixon presented Mrs. Bonnie Bickerstaff with the Employee of the Month award. Mrs. Bickerstaff has been employed by the Pierce County Recreation Department for thirteen years.

#### 10. Public Comment

- a. **Roger Hamelin** of 6205 Brooke Lane Blackshear came to see if there had been any updates behind Farr's. He said that the potholes were filled but would like to show the Road Department the correct way to do it. County Manager Raphel Maddox stated that the Codes Director Chris Bond has been out there taking pictures and was getting ready to issue citations.
- b. **Stephanie Bell** with Pierce County Family Connection at 707 Hendry St. Blackshear presented to the Board of Commissioners a report on Family Connections Programs. She stated that the county needs help with education, homelessness, and opioid use.
- 11. Request to rezone-Parcel #066A-090, 4.35 acres at 5950 Kennel Road, Patterson, from Single-Family to Agriculture/Forestry to relocate mobile home. Commissioner Graham Raley made a motion to approve. Commissioner Harold Rozier seconded. The motion carried.
- 12. Request to rezone- Parcel #035-067, 34 acres at 3401 Floyd Drive, Blackshear, Ga. from Agriculture/Forestry to Industrial for the Industrial Park. Commissioner Randy Dixon made a motion to approve. Commissioner David Loman seconded. The motion carried.
- 13. Request to rezone-Parcel #034A-034, 2.5 acres at 3344 Strickland Avenue, Blackshear, Ga. from Single-Family to Agriculture/Forestry for migrant housing. Commissioner David Lowman made a motion to deny. Commissioner Randy Dixon seconded. The motion carried.
- 14. Discussion of 14 Right of Ways on Forest Rd. in District 3. <u>Commissioner Randy Dixon made a motion to table this. Commissioner David Lowman seconded. The motion carried.</u>
- 15. Discussion and action to lease 10 vehicles from Enterprise. The County will be adding 10 leased vehicles from Enterprise making the total amount of county owned vehicles 69. The 10 new vehicles will arrive the first quarter of next year. They will be equipped with GPS and cameras facing the driver and the outside. For leasing 10 vehicles the estimated cost for one year will be \$113,752.52. Commissioner Randy Dixon made a motion to submit this to Enterprise. Commissioner Harold Rozier seconded. The motion carried.



16. Approve Engineering Agreement with CSX on Gilman Road and pay the permit fee in the amount of \$20,000.00.
