- 4. Call to Order Chairman Bennett called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM
- 5. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance Commissioner Mike Streat gave an invocation and Commissioner Randy Dixon led the pledge of allegiance.

6. Approval of the Agenda

- Recognition of Billy Johnson Retirement. Chairman Bennett presented a plaque to Billy Johnson in appreciation of his 37 years of service to Pierce County at the Road Department.
- 9. Presentation from Josie-Tatum Mattox on the Recycling Grant Project. Jason Rubenbauer, County Manager stated that the County had received a grant for a college student to do some research and look into recycling in Pierce County. Josie-Tatum Mattox was hired and completed the research and will present the information that she gathered. Josie-Tatum Mattox shared that she wasn't even aware of the recycling issues until she started her research and was shocked that most of our recyclables end up in a landfill. There are little to no options available to Pierce County. Several recyclers were contacted about servicing Pierce County and none of them were interested due to cost. Worked with the Chamber and Angela Manders and Matt Carter to develop a questionnaire to present to local businesses and to citizens in the county. Some of the businesses are interested in recycling paper, cardboard and plastics. Sentry here in Blackshear recycles paper and cardboard. Went to Piggly Wiggly and Walls IGA to do in person surveys of local citizens and people had little interest and the interested said it would depend on the cost. Contacted some other local governments and the level of participation varies, how the programs are run varies, as well as the cost and the success. Summary of the research findings would be that there are really no close options of providers available for Pierce County. There were some citizens who would like to have some recycling but they do not want to pay for it. Of the persons who participated there was not enough interest to pursue at this time.

### **Administrative Policy Indigent Burials Assistance Program**

Purpose: The Indigent Burials Assistance Program is to provide assistance for an individual That dies in Pierce County. Assistance will be provided to applicants who meet the program criteria in accordance with O.C.G.A § 36-12-5 &. An approval process can take up to 2 business days to complete.

Qualifications: In order to qualify for the Indigent Burials Assistance Program an applicant

must meet the following criteria:
☐ An applicant must have died in Pierce County.
☐ An applicant should not possess a Life Insurance Policy and/or have any income or financial resources over \$400.00.
<b>Approval Process:</b> In order to approve an application for the Indigent Burials Assistance Program the following criteria must be met:
☐ The County designee, as determined by the County Manager, or Chairman of the Pierce County Board of Commissioners, will obtain all applications and determine if an applicant qualifies for assistance.
$\Box$ The County designee will contact the next of kin of the deceased to verify there are no financial resources available to cover costs associated with the burial and/or cremation.
$\Box$ Upon meeting the eligibility requirements, the County designee will provide the decedent's family with a choice to proceed with a burial and/or cremation.
□ For the selection of a burial, the County designee will determine if the family has identified a funeral home, located within the boundaries of Pierce County, who has a valid business/occupation license In the event the family has not selected a funeral home, the County designee will assist the family with making a selection on a rotational basis of properly licensed funeral homes within the boundaries of Pierce County and shall contact the funeral home upon receipt of an application to verify approval or denial of application.
☐ For the selection of a cremation, the County designee will submit a request to verify the degree of relationship (i.e. birth certificate) and request for the applicant's family to submit an Application for Burial Assistance for an Indigent Person.
☐ The County designee will submit an Authorization to Release Remains form to the Pierce County Coroner. Note: This form will only be submitted to the Pierce County Coroner if the body is in the custody of the Pierce County Coroner.

☐ In the event a funeral home has received a body of a suspected indigent person who has died within the jurisdictional boundaries of Pierce County, and where no family members can be located, the funeral home shall contact the County designee who shall assist in the determination and processing of the Indigent Burial Assistance Program.
☐ Services <b>cannot be held</b> for the decedent before the approval process is completed.
☐ All burial and /or cremation allocated costs is to be paid based on the actual expense of the service not to exceed \$1,000.00. Once the funeral home has agreed to take the amount allocated for burial and/or cremation, the family <b>does not owe any more money</b> .
Process for Payment Reimbursement:
$\hfill \Box$ All original invoices must be submitted to the County Clerk within 10 days of the approval for services.
$\Box$ A payment will be distributed to the funeral home within 30 days once an invoice is received by the County Clerk.

# INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as "Agreement") made and entered into this 17th day of September, 2020, by and between the PIERCE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION, the governing authority of the Pierce County School District, (hereinafter referred to as "BOE"), and PIERCE COUNTY, GEORGIA, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, acting by and through the Pierce County Board of Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "County").

### **WITNESSETH**

WHEREAS, the County is responsible for and holds ownership of a gymnasium located at 705 College Avenue, Blackshear, Georgia (hereinafter referred to as the "gym");

WHEREAS, the Pierce County Schools, whose governing authority is the Pierce County Board of Education, desires to use the gym, located at 705 College Avenue, Blackshear, Georgia, for basketball practices during the 2020-2021 schools basketball season beginning October 2019;

WHEREAS, the gym is beneficial to student citizens who may participate in both County Recreation and BOE related recreational activities;

WHEREAS, the participation in such activities fosters a healthy development of mind, body, and spirit through activities that both the County and the BOE will benefit from for generations to come;

WHEREAS, a reciprocal agreement for use of facilities at area Pierce County schools, through strong collaboration, will be afforded to the Pierce County Parks & Recreation as the needs arise:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are desirous of entering into an intergovernmental agreement as provided for in Article IX, Section III, Paragraph I of the 1983 Georgia Constitution, as thereafter amended, to provide for joint services, for the provision of services, or for the joint or separate use of facilities or equipment as referenced herein;

WHEREAS, the parties desire to set forth their understandings in writing;

**NOW THEREFORE**, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and undertakings set forth herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the BOE and the County hereby agree as follows:

- 1) The County agrees to allow the Pierce County Schools use of the gym as availability of schedule, as maintained by the Pierce County Parks & Recreation Department, permits.
- 2) The BOE hereby agrees to maintain the facility during use as it would any facility under its operational jurisdiction to include the following;
- a) Ensure the facility is returned to its original state following each use;
- i.All areas cleaned to include (restrooms, kitchen, bleachers, flooring, etc.);
- ii.All lighting and heating and conditioned air systems must be turned off prior to vacating the facility;
- iii.Ensure no occupants are remaining inside or outside the facility prior to the coach leaving the facility:
- iv.All doors must be securely locked and checked prior to the coach leaving the facility;
  - b) Report any deficiencies of the facility to the Recreation Director or County Manager as soon as feasibly possible;
  - 3) The BOE, on behalf of the Pierce County Schools and the Pierce County School District, agrees to indemnify, release, and hold harmless all County elected or appointed officials, officers, agents, and employees from and against all liability, loss, costs, damages, fees and expenses (including attorney's fees) for any suit, claims settlement, award, penalty, fine, defense or judgment because of loss or damage to any person, property or right arising out of or in consequence of use of the gym as agreed upon.
  - 4) <u>Miscellaneous Provisions</u>.
  - a) <u>Notices.</u> Notice under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be effective when actually delivered. If mailed, notice shall be deemed effective 48 hours after mailing as registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, directed to the other party at the address set forth below or such other address as the party may indicate by written notice to the other:

- b) <u>Time.</u> Time is of the essence of this Agreement.
- c) <u>Modification</u>. The parties hereto agree in good faith to amend or modify this agreement where and when necessary. This Agreement may not be changed orally. All modifications of this Agreement must be in writing and must be signed by each party.
- d) <u>Survival.</u> Termination of this Agreement shall not affect the rights or obligations of the parties which arise prior to the termination.
- e) <u>Waiver.</u> Failure of any party at any time to require performance of any provision of this Agreement shall not limit the party's right to enforce the provision, nor shall any waiver of any breach of any provision be a waiver of any succeeding breach of any provision or a waiver of the provision itself for any other provision.
- f) <u>Assignment.</u> Except as otherwise provided within this Agreement, no Party hereto may transfer or assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Parties.
- g) <u>Law Governing.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia.
- h) <u>Presumption.</u> This Agreement or any section thereof shall not be construed against any party due to the fact that said Agreement or any section thereof was drafted by said party or its agent(s) or representative(s).
- i) <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement contains the entire understanding between and among the parties and supersedes any prior understandings and agreements among them respecting the subject matter of this Agreement. The Recitals above set forth are part of this Agreement.
- j) <u>Agreement Binding.</u> This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of the Parties hereto.
- k) <u>Further Action.</u> The Parties hereto shall execute and deliver all documents, provide all information and take or forbear from all such action as may be necessary or appropriate to achieve the purposes of this Agreement.
- l) <u>Good Faith, Cooperation and Due Diligence.</u> The Parties hereto covenant, warrant and represent to each other good faith, complete cooperation, due diligence and honesty in fact in all the performance of all obligations of the parties pursuant to this Agreement. All promises and covenants are mutual and dependent.
- m) <u>Savings Clause.</u> If any provision of this Agreement, or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance, shall be held invalid, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid, shall not be affected thereby.
- n) <u>Termination.</u> This agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual written consent of the parties. The agreement shall remain in effect until June 30, 2021 unless written notice is provided by either party.

Commissioner Mike Streat seconded the motion and all voted aye. Motion was approved.

17. Request to approve bid to resurface and repair a portion of Old Alma Rd, Meadow Wood Rd and Hacklebarney Rd. Chairman Bennett shared that the low bidder on the project was Allen Owens Construction of Blackshear at \$49,081.90 The Budget for this portion of the project was \$55,0000.00 so that was great news. This project will be paid for from TIA funds.

Commissioner Harold Rozier made a motion to approve the low bid from Allen Owens Construction for \$49,081.90. Commissioner Randy Dixon seconded the motion and all voted aye. Motion was approved.

18. Request to approve the bid for 2 fire apparatus. A portion of one to be paid from USDA grant and the other from the 14SPLOST. Santo Nino, Fire Chief stated that the two apparatus are a 01 International and a 98 International. They have low miles, pumps, water capacity and have been well taken care of and serviced. Our Fire Department is now 65 members strong. We are having more and more issue with getting parts to keep these older trucks in the fleet going. We want to continue to move forward and reduce the County ISO rating.

Commissioner Randy Dixon made a motion to approve the bids for an 01 E-One International for \$60,000.00 from Brindle Mountain Fire Apparatus and a 1998 International M & W for \$55,000.00 from Firetec ( Red House VFD). Commissioner David Lowman seconded the motion and all voted aye. Motion was approved.

19. Request approval to seek bids for a County Records Facility to be located on Strickland Ave (old annex property) not to exceed \$240,000.00. Chairman Bennett shared that the records building at Grady Street is deteriorating and we need to make a change to preserve the County records. This will start the process.

Commissioner Randy Dixon made a motion that we seek proposals for a County Records Facility to be located at Strickland Ave. Commissioner David Lowman seconded the motion and all voted aye. Motion was approved.

20. Discussion to consider a monthly stipend to the Coroner and Deputy Coroner of \$50.00 each. This is to offset time not otherwise compensated such as training days and other meetings. William Wilson, Coroner shared that when the coroner or deputy coroner goes to school they do not get compensated for the time. The initial training is 40 hours but annually they each have to attend 3 days of training. Chairman Bennett shared that they looked at some comparable counties to see how the coroner is compensated and more are the same as us or receive and set annual salary and not a per call pay. There is a House Bill #1099 that could come to pass at the first of the year that would make some changes to how Coroners are compensated. Jason Rubenbauer, County Manager shared that we currently pay mileage, registration, and \$173.00 per day to cover all other expenses, as is required by state legislation. It is being said that the current bill will be opposed by ACCG. Mr. Wilson stated that the Coroners Association says they intent for the position to continue to be elected. Commissioner Dixon clarified his understanding is that ACCG will not support the proposed bill. Commissioner Rozier said he would like to not do anything until we know more about the upcoming bill. Commissioner Streat asked if we might go ahead and make a change until the HB is passed or not. Commissioner Lowman stated that he believes if we make a change we wont be able to stop later. Commissioner Streat said for now we should follow the state guidelines and be cautious of how me might proceed otherwise.

Commissioner Randy Dixon made a motion that no action be taken to provide a stipend to the coroner or deputy coroner at this time, it can be re-evaluated after we see what happens with HB 1099. Commissioner Harold Rozier seconded the motion and all voted aye. Motion was approved.

21. Request to approve application for a GTIB Loan with a 5-year term currently at 0.21% for \$500,000.00 (\$500,000 financed for 5 years to be paid from SPLOST and TIA funds). Chairman Bennett stated that this would be for the Riverwoods subdivision area and Bonneyman Rd.

Commissioner Randy Dixon made a motion to move forward with the application for a GTIB loan of \$500,000.00 with the payments to be made from SPLOST and TIA funds.

<u>Commissioner Harold Rozier seconded the motion and all voted aye. Motion was approved.</u>
